- People send each other cards to mark their birthday.










- There are different religions which celebrate their own festivals.




Can you name all of the people in this nativity scene? What did they give to Jesus? Why was this baby so special?

# Reception (F2) Knowledge Organiser: Celebrations - Autumn 2

### Key Knowledge

#### Children will know that:

- Halloween is celebrated in Autumn each year.
- Diwali is a Hindu festival which also happens in October and fireworks are used to celebrate.



- Bonfire night remembers when Guy Fawkes tried to blow up the king in parliament.
- Bonfire night is celebrated on 5th November (learn the rhyme).
- To be safe around bonfires, fireworks and sparklers, they should keep their distance, wear gloves/protective clothing and always be supervised by an adult.



- Remembrance day is on the 11th of November every year, the date the First World War ended.
- Poppies are the symbol of remembrance day as they grew in the battlefields after the First World War.




- Birthdays happen annually.
