#### ABPS TRANSITION TO RECEPTION

#### Supporting your child in their transition to school journey

#### Beginning of June 2023

Parents and children invited to our Welcome meeting on Tuesday 13th June. Starter forms shared with direct entry children to complete and return to school.

#### Throughout June and July 2023

#### Visits to pre-school settings

A member of our EYFS team will visit your child in their pre-school setting if they attend one. We will begin to build a picture of your child and learn all about them in preparation for September. Some meetings might be phone calls or Zoom meetings if a visit is not possible.

#### July 2023

#### Start dates confirmed for September 2023.

Children will be sent their start date for September and any other information they will need in preparation for September.

#### September 2023

Children will start school from the week beginning  $4^{th}$  September. Start dates will be staggered across the week. To ease transition, we stagger the start dates across the week so children can get to know our adults and the environment in small groups.



# The Early Years Curriculum







### The Early Years Framework



Early Years education is called 'The Foundation Stage'. Your child is in the Foundation stage for two years as they move through Nursery and Reception class.

We follow the 'Early Years Foundation Stage 'curriculum as set out by the Department for Education The Statutory Framework for Early Years includes seven areas of learning and development which are important and interconnected...

Personal, social and emotional development
Physical development

### Foundation Stage Profile

- Children are continually assessed throughout the year
- Their profile is completed at the end of the year
- · All areas of learning have an Early Learning Goal
- Progress throughout the year will be discussed at parents meetings held in term 1 and term 2
- · We also have an open door policy all year
- EYFSP is reported to the local authority at the end of the academic year

#### Our Curriculum

- We aim to nurture children to enable them to become confident, aspirational and respectful, this links to our whole school values.
- Our carefully sequenced, knowledge rich curriculum identifies the core knowledge and skills that we want our children to know.
- Our curriculum will give our children the opportunity to develop their interests and love of learning so that they will continue to flourish on their learning journey into Year One and beyond.

### Our Curriculum

- Over a week in EYFS children will access discrete phonics, literacy, maths and topic lessons.
- These lessons are appropriate to the age and stage of the children.
- Alongside discrete lessons children have the opportunity to extend and consolidate their learning in the continuous and enhanced provision.

Forest Friday
Each week the children have the opportunity to learn in our outdoor classroom. Please can all children bring a pair of named wellington boots and a waterproof coat.







### Class Dojo



- · We use an online tool called Class Dojo
- We use it to inform parents of weekly learning, general school information and to celebrate children's achievements

### Helping at home

- · Encourage your child to dress themselves
- Talk in meaningful conversations
- Enjoy books together
- · Bake regularly
- · Count the stairs, count setting the table for tea
- Play games take turns
- Look at words and signs in the environment
- Play with water washing up with bubbles
- Sing nursery rhymes
- · Look at shapes and sizes compare
- Do jigsaws and puzzles
- Make things using scissors
- · Dress up and role play join in
- · Promote independence





### Uniform

- Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo or plain
- · Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore dress
- White polo shirt or shirt
- · black shoes or boots
- PE kit: white t-shirt and navy or black plain shorts or joggers; royal blue hoodie or plain navy or black hoodie and trainers.

- School starts at 8.45am. Children practice name writing/counting skills on arrival. This will develop throughout the year.
- Lates (after 8:50am) come in through the main front door and your child will be signed in and taken down by a member of staff. (try to be on time)

- School finishes at 3.15pm.
- Please ensure that staff know who is collecting your child
- Be aware that the children will be very tired for the first few weeks until they get into the routine of school - school is hard work when you are only 4!
